Crime Suppression Efforts

- **First Platoon**

- Officers left door hangers at a total of 26 businesses. Officers recorded checks totaling approximately 8 hours and 49 minutes.

- Officers continue to complete C.O.P. stops daily during their shift totaling 72 for the month.

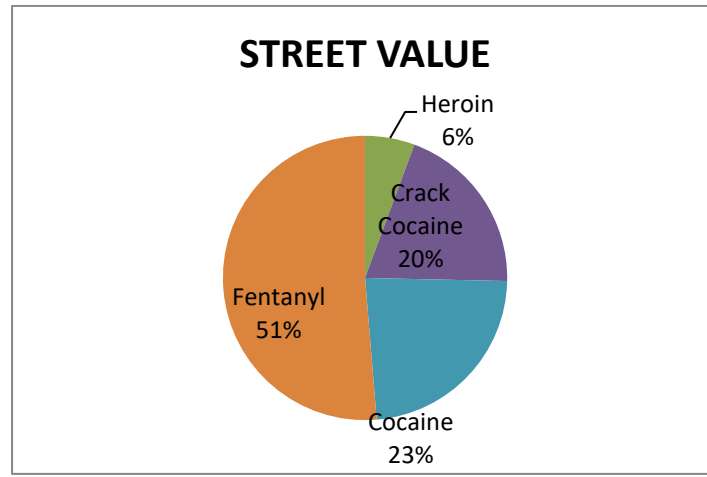

Operational Assignments

- Self-Contained Breathing Apparatus (SCBA) – A total of 10 air bottles were filled, 1 SCBA unit was repaired in-house.
- Radios – No issues or concerns to report.
- Hose – Will be scheduling annual hose testing for May.
- Vehicle Maintenance – Engine 1 had new front tires installed, and a new driver seat is on order. Engine 2 has an issue with the air horn that the City garage is attempting to resolve. Parts are on order for the generator on the Reserve Rig.
- Water/Ice Rescue – Weekly and monthly testing of boat 4 and equipment completed and in ready condition. Rescue boat 4 continues to be assigned at Station 1 while Veteran's boat launch is out of service due to high river levels.
- Small Tools/Equipment Maintenance – The nozzle bales arrived; 1 was placed at Station 1, the other at Station 2. Will be scrapping an old generator from Station 2. Ordering new rubber feet for Jaws power unit since they're worn away.
- Emergency Medical Services (EMS) – Supplies were ordered and received. Monthly QA checks on EMS run reports were completed.

- Michigan EMS Information System (MI-EMSIS) – Verified with MI-EMSIS that the reports for January were automatically submitted by ESO on our behalf.
- Continuing Education Units (CEUs) – CEUs were held on February 20, 25, and 28; topics were epinephrine injection and airway.
- Central Dispatch/911 Liaison – No complaints were received, and there were no issues that needed to be addressed.
- SDS Sheets – Books at all stations are current with no updates needed.
- Building Maintenance – Replaced emergency lighting on the apparatus floor at Station 5. Replaced the battering in the emergency lighting in the restroom at Station 5. Purchased new ceiling tiles for broken ones at Station 1. Working on a bid for new flooring in the basement at Station 1.
- Uniforms – A uniform order was placed.
- Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) – Completed all aspects of internal turnout gear inspections, sent another batch of gear out for advanced inspection, then re-distributed and inventoried accordingly. Repaired 2 broken helmets.
- City-Owned Automatic External Defibrillators (AEDs) – All city owned AED's are accounted for and in good working order.
- Supplies – An inventory was conducted with supplies ordered accordingly.
- Pre-surveys – Waiting to resume pre-surveys once new software has been purchased.

Regional Response Team 31/TECHNICAL RESCUE TEAM (RRT)
