- **First Platoon**
  - On June 24, officers assisted the Bay County Sheriff's Office with a foot pursuit of a domestic assault suspect. Officers from our agency assisted with setting a perimeter and tracking the suspect. He was located in the city and taken into custody without incident.

## Quality of Life Action Plan

- **First Platoon**
  - Officer handled 108 Quality of Life issues for a total of 20 hours and 13 minutes.
- **Second Platoon**

- **First Platoon**
  - Officers completed a total of 14 park checks for a total time of 2 hours and 44 minutes.
- **Second Platoon**
  - Officers completed a total of 27 park checks for a total time of 14 hours and 21 minutes.

## Traffic Enforcement Details

- **First Platoon**
  - 1<sup>st</sup> Shift Green Platoon officers worked traffic enforcement while on patrol for a total of 147 hours and 30 minutes working the following areas: Independence Bridge, Water Street, Saginaw Street, Broadway Ave, 32<sup>nd</sup> St, Smith St, Ausable State St, State St, Wenona Ave, Garfield Ave, Washington Ave, Thomas St.
  - 1<sup>st</sup> Shift Blue Platoon officers worked traffic enforcement while on patrol for a total 160 hours and 24 minutes in the following areas: Lafayette Ave, Madison Ave, Michigan Ave, Third St, Smith St, Trumbull Ave, Washington Ave, Midland St, Henry St, Jenny St, Wenona Ave.
  - On June 16, 1<sup>st</sup> Shift Green Platoon officers worked a speed enforcement and quality of life detail in the area of Midland Street and Keisel Street. A total of 10 traffic stops were conducted and 7 speeding violation citations were issued.
  - On June 19, 1<sup>st</sup> Shift Green Platoon officers worked a speed enforcement detail on Independence Bridge. A total of 14 traffic stops were made for speeding

violations. Six citations were issued for speeding, and 1 citation was issued for a violation of a temporary driving permit.

- On June 23, 1<sup>st</sup> Shift Blue Platoon officers worked a speed enforcement detail in the area of Thomas St and Wenona St. A total of 5 traffic stops were made for speeding violations. Three citations were issued for speeding.
- **Second Platoon**
  - 2<sup>nd</sup> Shift Blue Platoon officers worked traffic enforcement while on patrol for a total of 77 hours and 27 minutes working the following areas: Columbus Ave, E. North Union St, Garfield Ave, Henry St, W. Hart St, Madison Ave, McKinley Ave, Salzburg Ave Seventh St, State St, Third St, Washington Ave, N. Water St, and Wenona Ave
  - 2<sup>nd</sup> Shift Green Platoon officers worked traffic enforcement while on patrol for a total of 143 hours and 49 minutes working the following areas: Center Ave., Columbus Ave, Elm St., Fremont Ave., Hart St., Henry St. Independent Bridge, Jane St. Jenny St, Lafayette Ave., Linn St., N Madison Ave., Marquette Ave., Michigan Ave., Midland St., North Union St., Salzburg Ave., Thomas St., Washington Ave., Wenona Ave.
  - On June 20, 2<sup>nd</sup> Shift Green Platoon Officers worked a speed enforcement detail on Independence Bridge. 12 traffic stops were made for speed violations. 9 citations were issued.
  - On June 14, 2<sup>nd</sup> Shift Blue Platoon Officers conducted a Traffic Detail at Washington Ave and Columbus Ave. 5 traffic stops were made for speed violations. 1 citation was issued for speed.
  - On June 17, 2<sup>nd</sup> Shift Blue Platoon Officers performed a traffic detail at N. Henry St and W. Hart St. 8 traffic stops were made for speed violations. 2 citations were issued for speeding. 1 traffic stop was made for a Loud Car Stereo and a citation was issued. 1 traffic stop was made for a seatbelt violation and a verbal warning was given.

## Crime Suppression Efforts

- **First Platoon**
  - Officers completed 54 Park checks totaling approximately 7 hours and 24 minutes.
  - Officers completed 93 actions of “Appeared Secure” for building checks.
  - Officers left door hangers at a total of 20 businesses. Officers recorded checks totaling approximately 3 hours and 16 minutes.
  - Officers continue to complete C.O.P. stops daily during their shift totaling 175 for the month.

- **Second Platoon**

- Officers completed 117 Park checks totaling approximately 10 hours and 6 minutes.
- Officers completed 77 actions of “Appeared Secure” for building checks.
- Officers left door hangers at a total of 16 businesses.
- Officers recorded business checks totaling approximately 4 hours and 52 minutes spent on checks.
- Officers are continuing to do C.O.P. stops nightly, totaling 84 for the month.

### Detective Bureau Recap

- The Detective Bureau investigated a fraud case in which a man occupied a house for sale and claimed he had been given permission to rent it. A detective obtained a search warrant for phone records and completed witness and suspect interviews. The detective obtained a confession from the suspect.
- The Detective Bureau investigated a stabbing incident involving two men attending a party. Patrol Officers first responded to the hospital then learned of the incident's location and obtained a search warrant. A detective interviewed four subjects, one of which was the suspect. The detective built a case resulting in the Prosecutor's Office issuing a three-count felony warrant.

## Fire Operations Division



### Operational Assignments

- Self-Contained Breathing Apparatus (SCBA) – 5 air bottles were filled, and 1 air pack was repaired.
- Radios – The headset for 1 Aerial was replaced and returned to service.
- Hose – Inventoried all tested hoses as well as one newly purchased and received.
- Gas Meters – Nothing to report.
- Vehicle Maintenance – Engine 2 had a new seatbelt installed, electrical issues fixed, and preventative maintenance completed. Engine 4's defroster motor was fixed. 1 Aerial had a suspension issue that was resolved; bolts that hold the suspension and axel chassis to the frame were loose. Battalion 1's tailgate was fixed under warrantee. Battalion 1 had a new topper, slide out tray, and decals installed. The new Fire Marshal vehicle arrived; a slide out tray and decals were installed. The Training Officer vehicle had a new battery installed.
- Water/Ice Rescue – The handheld spotlight was received and placed into service for Boat 1. Weekly and monthly testing of Boat 4 and equipment was completed and is in ready condition. Rescue Boat 4 continues to be assigned at Station 1 while Veteran's boat launch is out-of-service due to high river levels.

- Small Tools/Equipment Maintenance – Still waiting to schedule annual inspections on jaws of life; COVID-19 has halted some operations. Still waiting on Fleet Department to dispose of the Station 5 lawnmower. Will order a replacement nozzle for a broken bale and new wheels for the PPV at Station 2 in July. The K12 saw for the 1 Aerial needs a new recoil which will be purchased in July. Annual ladder testing was completed; 2 failed, however both have been fixed and the ladder testing company provided a new passing report.
- Emergency Medical Services (EMS) – No new EMS purchases were made. All responding apparatus have been outfitted with new basic life support medication kits provided by Bay County Medical Control.
- Michigan EMS Information System (MI-EMSIS) – Verified with MI-EMSIS that the reports for May were automatically submitted by ESO on our behalf.
- Training – No additional training in June; on vacation June 11-30.
- Continuing Education Units (CEUs) – Boat rescue and extrication training were conducted.
- Central Dispatch/911 Liaison – All units responded to calls for service under normal dispatch protocols.
- Quality Assurance – NFIRS reports for the month of June were completed; achieved an average of 98% over the 11 categories that are reviewed.
- SDS Sheets – Books at all stations are current with no updates needed.
- Building Maintenance – Scheduled annual cleaning of the sewer catch basins, ideally to be done in July. The new door for Station 1 and door locks for all stations for unisex privacy measures were installed. The second-floor air conditioning at Station 1 will be fixed in July.
- Uniforms – Placed a small order for uniform jackets which has been partially received.
- Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) – Updated gear inventory in computer database, received recent batch of gear from inspection and re-distributed gear to personnel, prepared next round of gear to send out for advanced inspection, and repaired 2 helmets.
- City-Owned Automatic External Defibrillators (AEDs) – All city owned AED's are accounted for and in good working order.
- Hazardous Materials / Tier II – Nothing new to report.
- Supplies – An inventory was conducted and no supplies were needed.
- Pre-surveys – Waiting to resume pre-surveys once new software has been purchased in July.
