Quality Service Opportunities

- **First Platoon**

- On July 6th, a sergeant and an officer assisted an elderly citizen at a high rise. The citizen had sustained an injury from a fall earlier in the week and was hospitalized. The fall had occurred a couple blocks away from her high rise and her motorized wheelchair was left secured at the scene. The citizen called the station with concerns of retrieving her motorized wheelchair. The sergeant and the officer loaded the motorized wheelchair and returned it to the citizen.
- On July 31st, a sergeant assisted a motorist with mechanical issues at S. Water St. & Lafayette Ave. With assistance, the motorist was able to add transmission fluid to her vehicle so it could operate and avoid being towed.

- **Second Platoon**

- On July 1st, officers from the Nights Blue Platoon installed an air conditioning unit for a resident on 11th St. The resident has four small children and was not able to install it.

Agency Assist

- **First Platoon**
 - On July 8th, officers assisted Essexville Public Safety with a warrant attempt.
- **Second Platoon**
 - On Friday, July 17th, officers responded to the area of Green and Nebobish to assist the Essexville Public Safety Department with a vehicle pursuit. The suspects fled from a stolen vehicle and officers helped with the perimeter and neighborhood search.

- **First Platoon**
 - Officer handled 85 Quality of Life issues for a total of 9 hours and 54 minutes.

 - Officers completed a total of 11 park checks for a total time of 3 hours and 57 minutes.

Traffic Enforcement Details

- **First Platoon**

- 1st Shift Green Platoon officers worked traffic enforcement while on patrol for a total of 79 hours and 21 minutes in the following areas: Trumbull Ave, Washington Ave, Center Ave, Henry St, Birney St, Water St, Jenny St, Thomas St, Wenonah Ave.
- On July 23rd, 1st Shift Green Platoon conducted a speed enforcement and quality-of-life-related issues traffic detail in the area of Broadway Ave. & Cass Ave. Officers performed two traffic stops and issued one citation.
- On July 28th, 1st Shift Green Platoon conducted a speed enforcement and quality-of-life-related issues traffic detail in the area of S. Henry St. & E. Crump St. Officers performed four traffic stops and issued one citation.
- 1st Shift Blue Platoon officers worked traffic enforcement while on patrol for a total of 77 hours and 34 minutes in the following areas: Independence Bridge, AuSable State Rd, Thomas St, Marquette Ave, Hart St, Columbus Ave, Broadway Ave, Seventh St, Birney St, Center Ave, Water St, Jenny St, Wenonah Ave, Henry St, Salzburg Ave.
- On July 10th, 1st Shift Blue Platoon conducted a speed enforcement and quality-of-life-related issues traffic detail in the area of AuSable St and Murphy St. Officers performed three traffic stops and issued two citations.
- On July 30th, 1st Shift Blue Platoon conducted a speed enforcement and quality-of-life-related issues traffic detail in the area of Columbus Ave and Madison Ave. Officers performed three traffic stops and issued one citation.

- **Second Platoon**

- 2nd Shift Blue Platoon officers worked traffic enforcement while on patrol for a total of 62 hours and 42 minutes working the following areas: Au Sable State, Center Ave, Farragut St, Garfield Ave, Hart St, Henry St, W Jenny St, Kosciuszko Ave, W. Midland St, Marquette Ave, May St, Murphy St, Ninth St, Sixth St, Saginaw St, State St, Third St, Washington Ave, N Water St.
- On July 7th, 2nd Shift Blue Platoon conducted a speed enforcement and quality-of-life-related issues traffic detail in the area of Au Sable State and Murphy St. One vehicle was stopped and issued a warning.
- On July 8th, 2nd Shift Blue Platoon conducted a speed enforcement and quality-of-life-related issues traffic detail in the area of Au Sable St, and Murphy St. Officers performed two stops and issued one citation.
- On July 16th, 2nd Shift Blue Platoon conducted a quality of life related issues traffic detail in the area of Water St and Third St. Officers made seven stops for sign violations and two stops for loud car stereos. Seven citations were issued during the detail.

- 2nd Shift Green Platoon officers worked traffic enforcement while on patrol for a total of 84 hours and 14 minutes working the following areas: Broadway Ave, Columbus Ave, Fitzhugh St, Fremont St, Hart St, N Henry St, Jefferson St, Lafayette Ave, N Madison Ave, Marquette Ave, McKinley Ave, W North Union St, Salzburg Ave, N Sherman St, State St, Vermont St, Washington Ave, and S Wenona Ave.
- On July 31st, 2nd Shift Green Platoon conducted a speed enforcement and quality-of-life-related issues traffic detail in the area of Veteran's Bridge. Nine vehicles were stopped and eight citations for speed were issued.
- On July 31st, Night Shift Green Platoon conducted an enforcement detail near Wenona Park as part of the Wenona Park Action Plan. During their patrol no traffic violations were observed, and eight field contacts were made in Wenona Park.

Crime Suppression Efforts

- **First Platoon**

- Officers completed 97 Park checks totaling approximately 8 hours and 18 minutes.
- Officers completed 86 actions of "Appeared Secure" for building checks.
- Officers left door hangers at 3 businesses. Officers recorded checks totaling approximately 5 hours and 33 minutes.
- Officers continue to complete C.O.P. stops daily during their shift totaling 87 for the month.

- **Second Platoon**

- Officers completed 220 Park checks totaling approximately 8 hours and 33 minutes.
- Officers completed 124 actions of "Appeared Secure" for building checks.
- Officers left door hangers at 33 businesses.
- Officers recorded business checks totaling approximately 4 hours and 11 minutes spent on checks.
- Officers are continuing to do C.O.P. stops nightly, totaling 88 for the month.

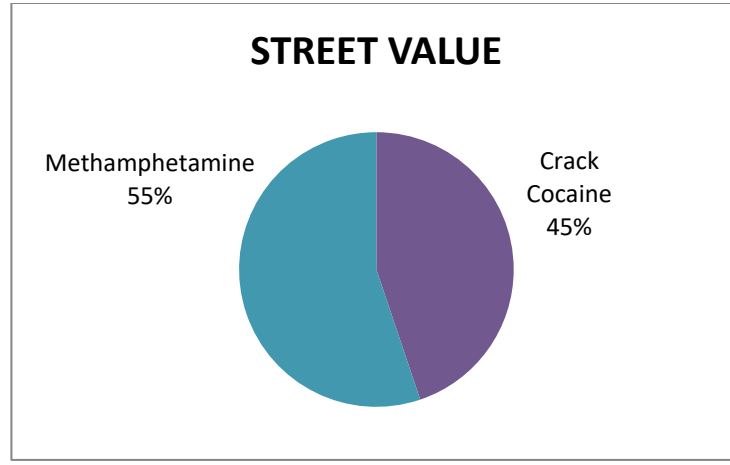

Fire Operations Division



Operational Assignments

- Self-Contained Breathing Apparatus (SCBA) – 29 air bottles were filled, and 3 air packs were repaired.
- Radios – In communication with Bay County Central Dispatch to make sure our current radio list is up to date with them.
- Hose – No new information to report.
- Gas Meters – No new information to report.
- Vehicle Maintenance – Engine 1 sending unit for the fuel system was installed and the water tank leak was fixed in one location but is now leaking in a new area. Engine 2 electrical issues were repaired, a new rear seal was installed in the driveline, and parts are ordered for the hydraulic leak around the power steering unit. Engine 4 had all new back tires installed. Engine 5 had 1 new back tire installed.
- New vehicles for the Fire Chief and Fire Marshall were put into service. The division also has a new 2500HD truck which replaced the old plow truck.
- Water/Ice Rescue – No new information to report.

- Small Tools/Equipment Maintenance – Still waiting to schedule annual inspections on jaws of life; COVID-19 has slowed operations. Continuing repairs on the PPV fans for E1 and E2. The thermal imaging camera on E2 was no longer working and replaced.
- Emergency Medical Services (EMS) – PPE stock is in good standing for all items required for safe interactions with the community. An order was placed for the following: Megamover patient extrication tools and blood pressure cuff set with various sized cuffs per state requirements.
- Michigan EMS Information System (MI-EMSIS) – Verified with MI-EMSIS that the reports for June were automatically submitted by ESO on our behalf.
- Continuing Education Units (CEUs) – Firefighter CPR and Communications training sessions were conducted.
- Central Dispatch/911 Liaison – All units responded to calls for service under normal dispatch protocols.
- Quality Assurance – NFIRS reports for the month of July were completed; achieved an average of 97% over the 11 categories that are reviewed.
- SDS Sheets – Books at all stations are current with no updates needed.
- Building Maintenance – The Sewer Department will clean the catch basins in all the stations in the next few weeks. The second-floor air conditioner was replaced at Station 1. There was a water leak in the second-floor locker room at Station 1 which may have been due to heavy rain; keeping an eye on it. Attended a pre-bid vendor meeting at Station 2 for the boiler replacement. Annual backflow testing was completed at each station.
- Uniforms – Currently creating an order for summer uniforms.
- Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) – Updated gear inventory in computer database, prepared new round of gear to send out for advanced inspection, repaired 1 helmet.
- City-Owned Automatic External Defibrillators (AEDs) – All city owned AED's are accounted for and in good working order.
- Hazardous Materials / Tier II – No new information to report.
- Supplies – An inventory was conducted, and an order was placed.
- Pre-surveys – Waiting to resume pre-surveys once new software has been purchased in 2020.
