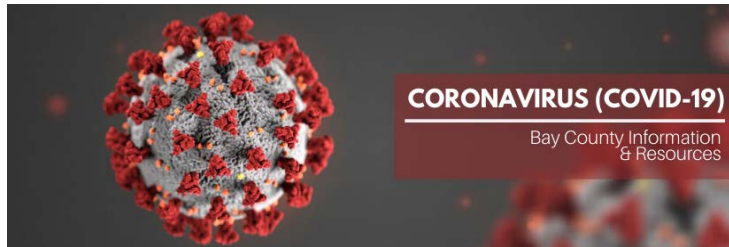

Bay City Department of Public Safety achieves accreditation by unanimous vote of the Michigan Law Enforcement Accreditation Commission

On February 11, 2021, Director Michael J. Cecchini, Deputy Director Caleb Rowell, and Captain Nathan Webster were interviewed by a committee from the Michigan Law Enforcement Accreditation Commission regarding accreditation of the Bay City Department of Public Safety.



The program and process are designed to accomplish the following goals:
establish and maintain standards that represent current professional law enforcement

practices; increases effectiveness and efficiency in the delivery of law enforcement services;

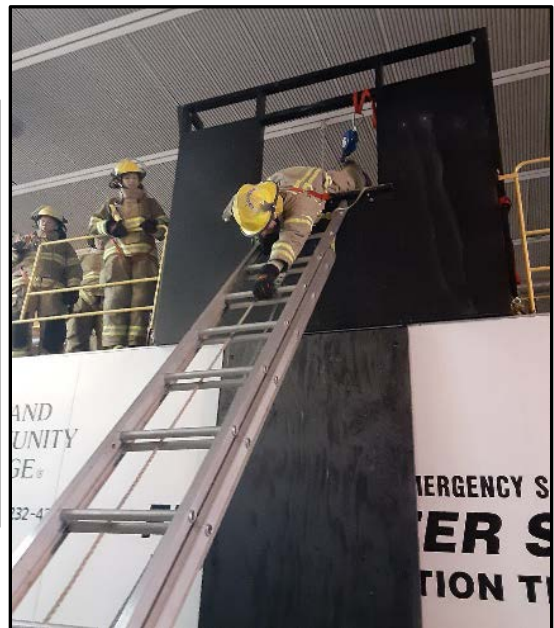
and establishes standards that address and reduce liability. The meeting concluded with a unanimous vote from the committee for full accreditation status.

Fire Academy students train with instructors from Oakland County Community College's Combined Regional Emergency Services Training (CREST) center.

CREST transported their mobile Rapid Intervention Team training trailer to Fire Station 1 for the academy to learn and practice skills based on real world fire related incidents. The trainees spent almost three days learning techniques concerning firefighter self-rescue, entrapment rescue, window bailouts, and team concepts, among numerous other skills.



Training in this manner is extremely valuable, as students will retain the lessons at a greater level than could be expected from just classroom presentations.





Wenona Avenue Reconstruction

The City is receiving over \$1 million from MDOT to reconstruct Wenona Ave. from Ionia to Fisher in 2021. The work includes reconstruction of the street, new watermain, new storm sewer, upgrades to sanitary sewer, and new sidewalks. Work is scheduled to begin in April, with completion in September. During the construction, traffic will be detoured on Henry Street. Access will remain for residents.

Preliminary bid information indicates Shaw Contracting is the low bidder at \$2,034,752, which is 10% lower than anticipated!

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
