**Speed Trailers used by the Patrol Operations Division**

The Bay City Department of Public Safety utilizes two speed trailers to address speeding concerns throughout the year. These units are comprised of a speed limit sign that can be changed and the display window showing a driver's speed. These units are deployed where a complaint has come in from a citizen or if an Officer feels one would be helpful.

The trailers keep a record of the number of vehicles, time of day and speed recorded. The data can then be used to deploy resources for enforcement or to review with a resident or City Official to show when or if there is an actual speeding problem.



### Fire Operations division staff participate in HAYO training

Bay City Department of Public Safety employees took part in 'Hey, Are You Okay?' (HAYO) this past week. The training program is designed to give first responders the basic tools to understand, recognize and react appropriately to signs that they or someone they know is dealing with more than they can psychologically and emotionally handle. Too many first responders feel they have nowhere to turn due to the daily stresses of life or the tragedy of just one bad call, resulting in unnecessary struggles or suicide. The four-hour class was a free course funded by the State of Michigan System Maintenance of Knowledge and Education (SMOKE).

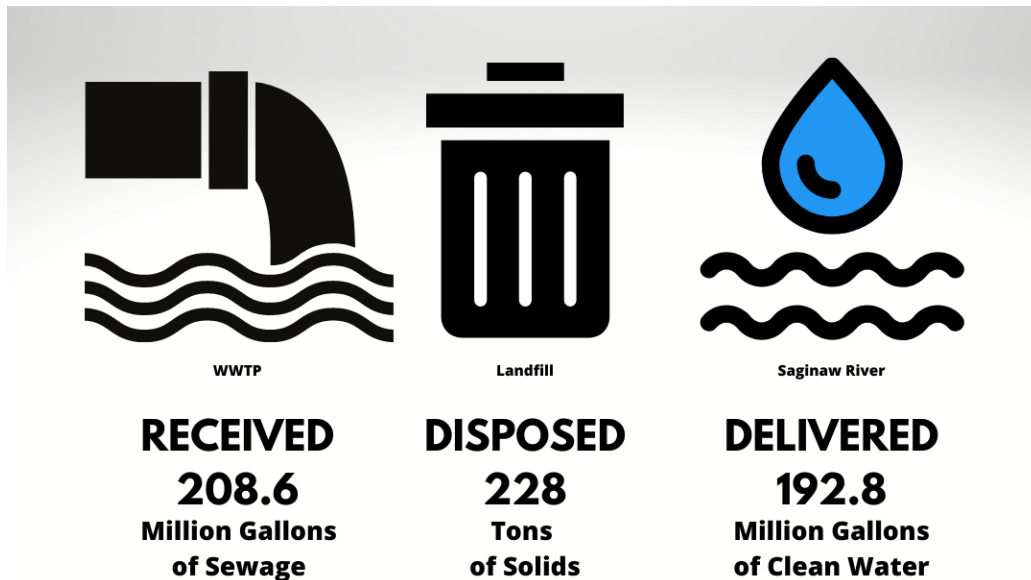

### Numbers for the month of March



Quarterly (Dry Weather) PCB carbon beds sampling was completed; all samples were non-detect for PCBs. In addition, quarterly PFOS sampling was completed, river samples were low (highest level was 16 ng/L) at Golson boat launch and our effluent was slightly elevated at 18 ng/L.

#### Progress continues the Ionia Street Project

Maintenance is continuing to make progress on the Ionia Street project. This project consists of replacing the electrical panel and installing SCADA at this lift station. When completed, all three of the City's lift stations (Boys & Girls Club & Mason Court) will be monitored at the treatment plant by Plant Operators 24 hours a day.
