City Manager and staff participate in Legislative Eye Opener

City Manager Muscott and Department Heads held a Legislative Eye Opener with State Representative Beson, State Senator Daley and Jake Bennett from Congressman Kildee's office this week.

Discussions were held regarding the City's applications for the Community Project Funding Under 2021 Surface Transportation Authorization Legislation (Wenona Phase II and Phase III and Smith Street Reconstruction), our Appropriations Funding for JCA and the Metropolitan vs. Micropolitan Status Proposed Change.

Updates were also given from each respective legislator on pending Senate and House bills.

Public Safety - Support Operations Division assist in MACP accreditation process.

On Tuesday, April 13th, the Support Operations Division Captain went to the Sterling Heights Police Department to participate in a mock assessment for the MACP accreditation process. The purpose of the mock assessment is to provide the Accreditation Manager of the agency an opportunity to evaluate and correct any compliance issues. Assessors came to Bay City in 2020, to do a mock assessment and this is the way to pay the process forward, by assisting other agencies in their quest for accreditation.



Public Works - Engineering construction projects updates



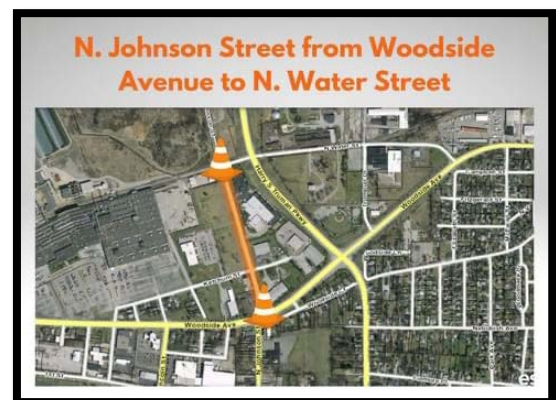
Wenona Avenue Construction is Underway

Wenona Avenue is scheduled to be closed between Ionia and Fisher Streets, beginning Monday, April 19th. Traffic will be detoured along Henry Street, and the construction is scheduled to continue through September. The project includes reconstruction of the pavement, replacement of the watermain and storm sewer, rehabilitation and repair of the sanitary sewer, new curb and gutter and sidewalks.

Shaw Contracting, of Bay City, is the contractor. The low bid was \$1,823,767. The City is receiving \$1,078,388 Federal funds through MDOT and BCATS. The remainder is being funded through the City Streets, Water and Sewer budgets. This is the first phase of three. In 2022, the project will extend north to Jane Street, and in 2023, it will extend to N. Union Street. The City is scheduled to receive Federal funds for the next two phases as well.

Johnson Street Reconstruction begins Wednesday

Johnson Street is scheduled to be closed between Woodside Avenue and Water Street., beginning Wednesday, April 21st, and construction is scheduled to continue through October. Businesses will be accessible from Water and Ketchum Streets. The project includes reconstruction of the pavement, replacement of the watermain and storm sewer, rehabilitation and repair of the sanitary sewer and non-motorized sidewalks. Champagne & Marx Excavating, of Saginaw, is the contractor. The low bid was \$2,016,450. The Marquette TIFA District is funding the project.
