Bay City Recycles is hosting an E-Waste and Tire Recycling Event today and tomorrow at the drop-off center, 2900 N. Water Street.



The event is designed to give City residents and other community members a no-cost or low-cost option to recycle items not taken curbside. The event runs from 8 a.m. to 2 p.m. on Friday, and again from 8 a.m. to 12 p.m. on Saturday. Typically, City residents and non-city residents must make an appointment at www.BayCityRecycles.org to utilize the facility.

There were no civilian or employee injuries during this incident. Automatic mutual aid was received from the Hampton Township Public Safety Department and the incident is currently under investigation by the Fire Marshal.

N. JOHNSON STREET

What a good-looking sidewalk! As you can see along N. Johnson Street between N. Water Street and Woodside Avenue, a lot of work is now complete on the curb and gutters, sidewalks, ADA elements and driveway approaches.

Coming soon we will see additional street base being laid ahead of street paving. The project is scheduled to last into October.



S. WENONA AVENUE



We're getting closer to S. Wenona Avenue looking more like a street than a construction zone each day!

The contractor is continuing to remove old concrete and roadway base in some areas, while also placing new roadway base in other sections.

Work is underway on the concrete curb and gutter, driveways and sidewalks as well. Look for more of the same over the next week. As a reminder, more work is planned for 2022 and 2023 for other parts of Wenona.



MARQUETTE AVENUE

Beginning Monday, Marquette Avenue will be closed to thru traffic between Transit Street and Martin Street. A detour is posted. Up to this point the street was maintained with a flag crew. All businesses remain open.



This week our Water team will be replacing service lines along the street. We expect milling of the existing street to begin later this week, ahead of new pavement being added.

This project impacts Marquette from Transit Street to E. Hart Street; however, we have broken up the project into two phases. The first phase runs from Transit Street to Martin Street, with the second phase extending from Martin to E. Hart Street. Work is scheduled to last through September.

PLEASE NOTE: Trash, yard waste and recycling pickup will remain unchanged until further notice. However, pickup times may vary. Be sure to have your containers to the curb no later than 7 a.m. on your regular service day.
