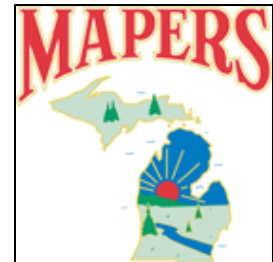

We handled a little bit of everything Thursday. Another crew was responsible for helping get the Bay Area Water Treatment Plant off generator power and back on the grid.
