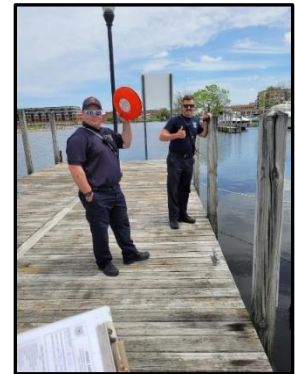

Public Safety

Fire Operations Division:

On June 1st, the Bay City Department of Public Safety, Fire Operations Division had rescue boat Marine 1 safety-checked by the United States Coast Guard Auxiliary (USCGA). The USCGA offers this 15-point inspection to make certain water rescue crafts have all the proper safety equipment on board and that they are in working order. Marine 1 received passing results in all categories, making it ready for not only rescue missions, but the boater safety training employees will receive later this month.
