Public Safety

Patrol Operations Division:

On Monday, June 6th, Public Safety Officer Brandon Cooper was awarded the Crime Stoppers Officer of the Year Award. Vice President Teresa Tromba presented PSO Cooper with the honor at the City Commission meeting.



Fire Operations Division:

On June 8th, at approximately 6:20 a.m., Bay City Department of Public Safety units were dispatched to the 400 block of S. Sheridan Street for a structure fire. Units arrived to find smoke coming from the eaves of a two-story house. The resident stated that she was awoken by smoke detectors and was able to safely exit the residence with her daughter under heavy smoke conditions. Suppression crews initiated a fire attack, locating heavy fire in the first and second stories. The fire was extinguished, overhaul operations were conducted, and crews cleared the scene at 10:10 a.m. Automatic aid was received by Hampton Township Department of Public Safety and mutual aid by Portsmouth Township Fire Department. There were no civilian or employee injuries. The fire is currently under investigation by the Fire Marshal.
