<p align="center"><b>Proposal 22-1</b>  <b>A proposal to amend the state constitution to require annual public financial disclosure reports by legislators and other state officers and change state legislator term limit to 12 total years in legislature</b></p>	<p>Shall the limitation on the amount of general ad valorem taxes which may be imposed each year under Article IX, Sec. 6 of the Michigan Constitution of 1963, as amended, in Bay County be increased by no more than .7 of a mill (70 cents per \$1,000 of taxable value) for a period of 6 years, 2022 through 2027, inclusive, to be used for the continued operation of and capital improvements to the Bay County Animal Services and Adoption Center (formerly known as "Animal Control") including construction of an addition or new building as authorized by 1919 Public Act 339, raising an estimated \$2,193,193.79 in the first year the millage is levied?</p> <p align="right">Yes <input type="radio"/> No <input type="radio"/></p>	<p>This proposal will allow the school district to continue to levy the statutory rate of not to exceed 18 mills on all property, except principal residence and other property exempted by law, required for the school district to receive its full revenue per pupil foundation allowance and restores millage lost as a result of the reduction required by the Michigan Constitution of 1963.</p> <p>Shall the currently authorized millage rate limitation on the amount of taxes which may be assessed against all property, except principal residence and other property exempted by law, in School District of the City of Bay City, Bay and Saginaw Counties, Michigan, be renewed by 18 mills (\$18.00 on each \$1,000 of taxable valuation) for a period of 20 years, 2024 to 2043, inclusive, and also be increased by .5 mill (\$0.50 on each \$1,000 of taxable valuation) for a period of 20 years, 2024 to 2043, inclusive, to provide funds for operating purposes; the estimate of the revenue the school district will collect if the millage is approved and 18 mills are levied in 2024 is approximately \$10,434,524 (this is a renewal of millage that will expire with the 2023 levy and the addition of millage which will be levied only to the extent necessary to restore millage lost as a result of the reduction required by the "Headlee" amendment to the Michigan Constitution of 1963)?</p> <p align="right">Yes <input type="radio"/> No <input type="radio"/></p>
