

# Tree Planting Options



## Crimson King Maple

*Acer platanoides*



**DESCRIPTION:** 45' tall x 30' wide. Popular for its purple-green foliage throughout summer. Leaves turn brown, dark maroon, or bronze in the fall before dropping. The oval to rounded crown fills with maroon-yellow flowers in the spring.

## Autumn Blooming Cherry

*Prunus subhirtella 'Autumnalis'*



**DESCRIPTION:** 35' tall x 35' wide. Double-flowered tree. Usually with a multiple trunk, slender, upright branches, and a rounded canopy. The canopy on older trees often grown wider than the tree grows tall. Before leaves appear in the spring, the trees are covered with many semi-double pink flowers; some flowers may also appear in the autumn if the weather is sufficiently warm. The one to four-in-long dark green leaves are later joined by the appearance of small, black berries.

# Tree Planting Options

## Zelkova 'Green Vase'

*Zelkova serrata*



**DESCRIPTION:** 100' tall x 80' wide. Zelkova is often listed as a replacement for American Elm since it has roughly the same vase shape. Zelkova is massive, with the trunk capable of growing to four feet or more in diameter. Leaves are 1.5 to 4 inches long, turning a brilliant yellow, orange, or burnt umber in the fall.

## Japanese Lilac

*Syringa reticulata*



**DESCRIPTION:** 30' tall x 15' wide. Its upright habit varies from symmetrical to irregular. The huge clusters of creamy white flowers, borne in early summer for about two weeks, are the main ornamental feature but lack the fragrance of the spring-blooming Lilacs. Green fruit clusters are somewhat showy when viewed from close range.

# Tree Planting Options



## Yoshino Cherry

*Prunus x yedoensis*



**DESCRIPTION:** 45' tall x 40' wide. Has a beautiful bark marked with prominent lenticels but is a relatively short-lived tree. The white to pink flowers which occur in early spring before the leaves develop are sometimes damaged by late frosts or very windy conditions.
